

Project Overview

- Rethinking FYE one-shots by connecting students to OU's and major's history with our special collections
- Collaboration between two departments within library
- Explore alternate approaches to FYE one-shots
- Still having a lesson-plan centered on Frameworks
- Measure intrinsic motivation instead of library skills
- Provide students with an experience that most other freshmen do not

- History of strong ties between hospital, campus, and community






In Case of Lunacy.

What is UC 1900?


- Freshman course for majors.







Limitations

- What we wanted to hear?
- Small number of participants
- Hindsight
- Connect pre- and post-test
- Only captured in the moment feelings, nothing longer-term



Assessment takeaways:

- We did see a shift! (In most questions)
- Using archives appears to be effective in generating enthusiasm for the major and the library
- Helped students clarify or solidify feelings about their major (or not)





Future of project:

- Keep going!
- Better align the worksheet with the survey
- Rethink Likert statements
- Strategic recruitment of UC1900
